





Billy Waggle-Dagger, aka William Shakespeare, has a train named after him called "The Shakespeare Express". On Sunday the 18th of August last myself & M went for a trip on this steam train which also included lunch on board.



5043 Earl of Mount Edgcumbe

This train runs from Stratford-Upon-Avon to Birmingham Show Hill and return. It was very good of them to bring us back.

The loco on duty for our ride was the former GWR single chimney Castle no 5043 Earl of Mount Edgcumbe. On the outward journey she ran boiler first and tender first on the return. I thought they may have turned it at Tyseley, but no.

We arrived in good time, about an hour before it was due to depart, but within 10 minutes of arriving the steam train arrived back from its previous trip. Our train was the 11:35 from Stratford. We left on time and the Earl had to work hard on the journey for the 1:75 climb on Bishopton Bank out of the station.

We had booked lunch using the Premier Dining option. You pay a bit more but you are assured of no screaming kids, push chairs and shouting parents. On the downside I thought the menu selection was bit lacking.





At a certain section on the outward journey the train gets up to its maximum allowed running speed for a few miles. To be whisked along at 75 mph by a steam loco was something I haven't experienced for many years—probably not since 1964. The four cylinder Castle was very smooth.
