The Parents and Guardians of Junior Members and their Retention

Les mentioned at the AGM in October, that we may not be retaining junior members, as parents felt awkward staying around and not being involved in club activities.

It was stressed that the Club has a Safeguarding policy, the key part of which insists that parents or guardians must stay with their child as club members do not have the CRB or equivalent qualification to look after other people's children and neither did they wish to in view of these regulations.

Les said we should try to make parents and guardians more welcome by engaging with them and set up a social space with a table and chairs as a coffee area. The aim of this area is for parents and guardians to socialise/chat with each other over a cup of tea or coffee etc..

In practical terms this will probably have to be on the left hand side of the hall as you enter, and be positioned just past the stack of chairs. Members will need access to the chairs and tables along with access to the signing in sheets.

We shall experiment with this idea and see how it goes. We will need to acquire a low height table for parents and guardians to put their drinks on. All the hall owned tables are at dining height, which is too formal.

Just a reminder for all members to be aware of the sharp edges on our metal trestles. All the trestles now have an identification number, so if you find one that is particularly troublesome, then please let a committee member know so we can deal with the urgent cases first.



The Clubs External Storage Shed

During the summer we managed to get a coat of wood preservative onto the external sides of our shed. This was the first coat to be applied for two years. Next year we will get another coat applied.



There is another important job that needs doing before the winter sets in and that is to deal with the door and the immediate floor area behind the door and the floor that is exposed outside.

When it rains the water is dripping off the door and causing the hardboard flooring to swell up. In addition we have another problem in that the water draining off the door is rotting away and delaminating the main flooring Sterling/Block Board that is exposed to the external elements.

We have a draught excluder door brush to be applied to the bottom of the door on the external side which hopefully will stop water from being blown into the shed. We just need to consider now how to deal with the floor that has become delaminated. Anyone with any ideas please let a committee member know please.

The exhibition was opened by Radio Northampton presenter Bernie Keith.




Not to be satisfied with just one Radio Northampton personality turning up, we had a second.

Here Jules from the Treasure Quest programme, visited us as one of her clues to find the 'treasure'.




