


Last summer whilst on our annual holiday to Devon, we visited Plymouth. This we did by rail from Paignton to Plymouth (formerly Plymouth North Road), via Newton Abbot.

The route into Plymouth takes you by the TMD at Plymouth Laira. The former and last home of the Western diesel hydraulics.





The entrance to the station formerly known as Plymouth North Road.





Whilst exploring Plymouth, I found this building in a street near the harbour in the Barbican.

The London and South Western Railway (LSWR) existed from 1838 until the 1922 grouping. Its network extended to Dorchester and Weymouth, to Salisbury, Exeter and Plymouth, and to Padstow, Ilfracombe and Bude. It built a network of routes in Hampshire, Surrey and Berkshire, including Portsmouth and Reading.

The LSWR obtained running powers over the South Devon and Launceston Railway, giving it access to Plymouth over that line.







In the last newsletter I mentioned some track changes had taken place on the layout. I'm going to share with you what has changed and why.

Just to recap the original layout built to the Graham Farish Magnum track plan had only one circuit that could be used for continuous running by one train.



Below is what I did initially to give intertest by extending two sidings into a high level additional oval (marked in purple)



You will note that access from the original oval to the new high level oval is by a one direction set of points (turnouts). Once on the high level section the only way back was to reverse back through the points from whence the train originally came. You can guess what happens when you try and do that.

The answer to get trains back onto the main oval was to add a new set of points. Below is the work involved in doing that.



First job remove the platforms, cut and lift the track and then scrap away the old ballast.



Next was to place the new points in position and see how best to line them up with the track that wasn't lifted. The baseboard joint was a governing factor here.



Once happy with where the points were going to go, then the connecting tracks were placed in position.



The connecting tracks over the baseboard joints is by the proven method of soldering the track to copper clad sleepers.



The new points in place with connecting tracks in place.

Also the tracks bridging the baseboard joints have been cut with a Dremel.

The first loco to test out the new points was D1005 Western Venturer.

If she couldn't negotiate the points then no other loco would.





Even the Dapol Hall got through the points without coming off. This is no 5999 Wollaton Hall. The loco has its motor in the tender driving through a cardan shaft to the loco. There are also two traction tyres on the rear driving wheels. Everything that can make the loco derail has been built into it— a total recipe for disaster. Well done Dapol!
