

Dial-a-Train

(or Run Your Trains from Your Mobile Phone)

Some of you may have seen at model railway exhibitions, layout operators running the layout from their mobile phone. I certainly have and was interested in knowing how it was done. I suppose latterly coming from a career in IT this sort of thing would intrigue me. I had deduced that it had be done where a layout was been run under DCC.

When I first introduced Digitrax to my layout a number of years ago now, the only cable free way of running the trains was through Infrared technology. This had its limitations in that two infrared devices needed to be in line-of-sight with each other to work. Next came along wireless technology which got round this handicap. But whether using infrared or wireless I needed the Digitrax brand devices to do it.

Time has moved on and things change and develop. The next step that developed was the ability to run a DCC layout from a computer. This step then spawned a number of software packages to do this this. Unfortunately these packages were not cheap. Luckily there are a number of software developers in our world who believe in Open Source software. This is basically software that is either free or very cheap, fully distributable and you can add and develop it yourself from the source code. One such piece of software that falls into this category is JMRI (Java Model Railroad Interface). As the name implies it uses Java as its core operating system. Hence it will run on Windows, Mac or Linux and a number of others.

Within the JMRI package there is a facility to run an application called WiThrottle. This application allows JMRI to talk to a remote device via a wireless connection (providing the PC or laptop has a wireless connection also). Supported devices are listed on the JMRI web site. In my case I connect my mobile phone which is running Android. The only other pieces of hardware you need is a wireless router and an interface between your DCC system and a computer. The router provides the wireless link between the computer and the remote device; in my case my phone. The illustration on the next page hopefully makes things easier to understand.

Sloppy Duchess

There is nothing worse than having a sloppy woman on your layout. Its even worse when that woman is connected to the aristocracy. On my layout I had such a woman; she was the "Duchess of Montrose".

This was Hornby's OO gauge version of one of Stanier's famous Princess Coronation Pacific's that I purchased last year.

Basically this loco suffered from the same problem as was commonly reported with the Heljan Class14 "Teddy Bear". The problem being excess lateral movement of the driving wheels— what I call "slop". I thought at first it was a back-to-back measurement issue with the flanges. I checked this with a gauge I had, and all was fine. The chassis appeared to be normal width, but presumably it couldn't have been. The problem came to light when I kept getting repetitive derailments on negotiating a particular set of facing points or turnouts (whatever you want to call them).

In a nutshell I eventually saw that the problem was the excessive sideways movement. What was correct on paper was not correct in reality i.e. if the back-to-back on the flanges was Ok she shouldn't come off. At speed this "slop" seemed to create an oscillating effect as the chassis was allowed to slide too much on the axles. The next step was to solve it. I didn't fancy stripping the valve gear and connecting rods down to remove the wheels, so I opted for plan B.

This was to insert a circlip or E-clip over the axle. I only put them on the outer two axles and on the same side as each other. I left the centre axle with plenty of movement. The E-clips I used are marketed by Rolson and you can buy an assorted box of these. I found that an E-clip sized 3.2mm diameter did the trick. So far so good—no more derailments.
