

Bachmann Plasser Theurer Track Vehicle


In the last newsletter I stated that I would show you how to make this model work with DCC and add operating lights each end. Its supplied by Bachmann purely as a motorised unit. It does NOT come DCC ready.

This modification basically fits into two operations. The first is to fit the decoder, the second is to fit the lights.

As I have mentioned this motorised model is not DCC ready for some reason. The first job is to fit a decoder. We have two ways of doing this, namely hard wire it or fit a socket. I opted for the second . The reason being that if you need to change the decoder for any reason then all you need to do is unplug the old one and plug in its replacement. I decided to fit an eight pin socket. This has gone into the end with the biggest cab. The drivers seat and controls had to be removed to make room for the decoder.

It is advisable to stick to the standard NMRA colour coding for the wires. This is red and black for the wheel pick up and grey and orange for the motor connections,

The wire you need should be ultra thin flexible wire 30 AWG / 0.5mm multi-strand wire.

You will also require an eight pin socket, a soldering iron with a tip approx. 2mm, solder, flux and about 100 different tools which at the outset you don't think you will need but in the end you will use them. I nearly forgot; a great deal of patience.

The decoder harness and socket, which came pre wired, I got from eBay. Unfortunately the wire used is a little too thick, but never the less I managed to shoe horn it all into the cab. The decoder I used here is the Gaugemaster DCC29 Omni. If I ever upgrade to a sound chip, subject to one being available, then that should be interesting fitting that in.

Once the decoder was fitted I then reassembled the unit. Although you can see the wires passing through the open frame of the Tamper; you can paint these black and they will hopefully look like hydraulic pipes. Only the rivet counters will know any different.

Once happy that it performs as it should, the next job is to fit lights. Before I go on to that subject, I will first do an article on LEDs, the various methods of wiring them, and using LEDs with DCC and the type of LEDs available.



If the station planning for the new Four Oakes Junction layout goes wrong this is the architect we will be blaming—Jess. Once sat on the plans she didn't want to give them up.
