We manged to get there and back on the train alright, despite the threat of industrial action by the RMT. Initially when we first arrived at Castle Station we were told to get on a Poynter's coach, and this would take us to Rugby via Long Buckby. The idea being once at Rugby we then catch a Pendelino or the like. However, having been sitting on the bus for about 10 minutes awaiting departure, we were then herded of this and onto a train they had found.

I wasn't really enamoured by the quality of the layouts this year. There was nothing I would call outstanding. There were two layouts that appealed to me; one was Lough MPD and the other Holly Park.


Lough MPD was a Western Region layout, as the name suggests, of a motive power depot during the transition period of steam to diesel. At one end and centre were the steam locos of the former GWR plus one or two interlopers. At the other end, where I was were the diesels of BR (W). Now lets think what sort of traction did the Western Region go for in their choice of diesels—Oh yes Diesel Hydraulic. As the picture over leaf shows, on shed was a Hymek, Western, D800 Warship and D600 Warship.

The other layout that appealed to me was Holly Park. This layout brought back memories for me when my father was alive and he built me and my brother a Hornby Dublo 3-rail layout. As my father died when I was only 11, anything I see relating to HD 3-rail always brings back poignant memories. I still have all my 3-rail track, locos and rolling stock.

The following items are available:


A price list is also in the club folder.
